

Vertex Foundation to Donate 10,000 Meals for Front-Line COVID-19 Health Care Workers at Two Boston Hospitals This Week

Donation to Frontline Foods will supply 10,000 meals to workers at Brigham and Women's Hospital and Massachusetts General Hospital

Purchase of the meals from local restaurants will also support restaurant employees impacted economically by COVID-19

BOSTON – May 11, 2020 – Vertex Pharmaceuticals Incorporated (Nasdaq: VRTX) today announced that the Vertex Foundation, a nonprofit charitable foundation, will cover the costs of meals from local restaurants for COVID-19 front-line health care workers at two Boston hospitals this week as they deal with the pandemic's impact on the city.

This donation is part of the recent \$5 million commitment by the Vertex Foundation to support organizations that are providing on-the-ground COVID-19 emergency relief and assistance focused on essential health care and health supplies and providing support for vulnerable populations in the global communities where Vertex operates.

Partnering with the grassroots organization Frontline Foods, the Foundation has made a donation to ensure that front-line COVID-19 health care workers at Brigham and Women's Hospital and Massachusetts General Hospital receive a total of 10,000 nutritious meals starting on May 11. The meals will feed physicians, nurses, janitorial staff, security and others working on the front lines of this pandemic. The purchase of the meals from local restaurants will also help support employees who have been affected by COVID-19 economic impacts. There are several restaurants partnering in this effort including: Flour, Eastern Standard/Branch Line and Orinoco.

"Our front-line health care workers are the true heroes of the COVID-19 pandemic, putting their lives at risk every day to help patients survive," said Jeffrey Leiden, M.D., Ph.D., Executive Chairman at Vertex. "As this pandemic continues, these funds will provide thousands of nourishing meals during their incredibly grueling shifts, while also providing economic sustenance to local restaurants and their workers. We are in this together, and we are humbled to be part of this very special community in Boston that comes together in times of crisis to support the most vulnerable."

Frontline Foods is a grassroots organization that raises money from the community to pay local restaurants to prepare meals for the heroes responding to the COVID-19 crisis. Fueled by a growing army of over 700 volunteers, Frontline Foods has raised over \$5M and delivered more than 300,000 meals to frontline workers in more than 300 hospitals nationwide — so far. Frontline Foods is partnered with World Central Kitchen, a tax-exempt, registered 501(c)(3) charitable organization.
